- Puzzle book (Crosswords, Sudoku, Word Find)
- Holiday themed writing pens or pencil
- Holiday candy (in sealed wrapping or small unopened bags)
- Candy Canes
- Peanut Brittle
- Socks
- Travel sized games
- Card games (Uno, Phase 10)
- Stress balls (holiday themed preferred)
- Gloves (preferably black; winter; one size fits all)
- Single serving cookie packages

Please AVOID putting the following items in the stockings:
