October 2 thru March 31	Ground Decorations Permitted

2ND COLLECTION

Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, President of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, is asking that an emergency collection be taken up the first weekend in October (September 30/October 1) on behalf of those devastated in parts of the Caribbean and the United States by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma. The emergency collection is greatly needed to help victims rebuild their lives and also help support reconstruction needs of churches destroyed or severely damaged. These funds will be used in the affected areas to support humanitarian aid, assistance with long-term efforts to restore communities after widespread destruction, and for the pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church in the U.S. and the Caribbean, especially the Diocese of St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands. The Church itself in these regions is both a long-standing provider of aid and now is in need of tremendous assistance itself. So many of the Church's structures have been damaged and their resources depleted which makes it even more challenging to provide assistance and pastoral outreach to those in need.
