NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ABORTED CHILDREN

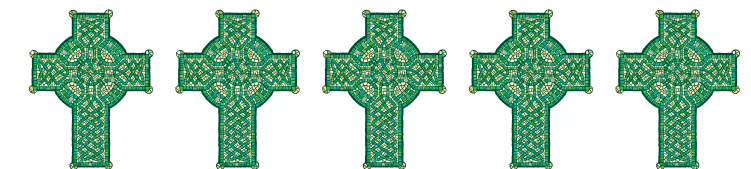
