Communal Anointing of the Sick with Holy Mass

Tuesday, November 5th – 6:30p.m.
Saint Patrick Church

Please come and experience the grace of this sacrament if you are seriously or chronically ill (physically, psychologically or spiritually), preparing for surgery or experiencing difficulties in old age.



The Sacrament of Anointing...a graced encounter...

The sacraments continue to saving mission and ministry of Jesus Christ through time and space “until the end of the age” so that every person may receive His salvation, grace, love and mercy. We see this truth clearly in the Sacrament of Anointing. In this sacrament, Jesus’ healing power and compassion are given to the sick and dying.

Jesus spent much of his ministry healing; the blind, lepers, the deaf and mute, the lame, as well as casting out demons and raising the dead. His ministry was an incarnation of the mercy and compassion of our Heavenly Father. His suffering, death and resurrection is both a foreshadowing and an extension of his victory over sin and death. The sacraments recall the blessed hope that humanity (and all creation) will be restored to its original dignity and whole-ness.

In the earliest traditions of both the Eastern and Western Church, we find the liturgical celebration of anointing with blessed oil and praying over the sick and dying. From at least the Middle Ages on, anointing was celebrated more exclusively with persons at the point of death and became known as *Extreme Unction*. In the liturgical reforms of Vatican II, the original practice of anointing persons with serious illnesses (which were not necessarily life-threatening) was restored.

Who should/may receive The Sacrament of Anointing? Anyone suffering from a serious or chronic illness, facing surgery, experiencing the frailty of old age, or in danger of death should seek this sacrament. Such suffering may be physical, emotional, psychological or spiritual. Many parishes offer communal celebrations of anointing. Individuals needing the sacrament outside of these regular times should speak with their parish priest. Likewise, Pastors are called to make themselves generously available for such needs.

What does the Sacrament of Anointing accomplish within us? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us that there are four effects:

- 1) “The first grace of this sacrament is one of strengthening, peace and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of serious illness or the frailty of old age. This grace is a gift of the Holy Spirit...and is meant to lead the sick person to healing of the soul, but also of the body if such is God’s will. Furthermore, if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.” (CCC 1520)
- 2) By the grace of this sacrament, the sick person unites his suffering to Christ’s Passion and death: “in a certain way is consecrated to bear fruit by configuration to the Savior’s redemptive Passion. Suffering, a consequence of original sin, acquires a new meaning; it becomes a participation in the saving work of Jesus.” (CCC 1521)
- 3) This sacramental union of the sick person with the death and resurrection of Christ benefits the whole People of God and contributes to the sanctification of the world. (para CCC1522)
- 4) The Sacrament of Anointing prepares us for the final journey, perfects our conformity to Jesus Christ, points us to the ultimate victory of eternal life and completes the anointing of baptism and confirmation. “The last anointing fortifies the end of our earthly life like a solid rampart for the final struggles before entering the Father’s house.” (CCC 1523)

As any priest can readily share, we have been blessed to be ministers of the sacrament of anointing. Through it, we have witnessed the powerful healing of Jesus; both in remarkable and humble ways. Most of the time, this sacrament simply accomplishes what our Catechism says it does....suffering members of the Body of Christ find peace, consolation and compassion. They feel the Lord’s deep love and the concern of the Church. They come to understand that their pain, weakness and fragile state have a higher meaning because they come into deeper union with our Crucified and Risen Lord.
